
JSTOR Archive Collections: September 2017 Update

Arts & Sciences I

Established in 1997, JSTOR's first collection includes core journals in economics, history, political science, and sociology, as well as in other key fields in the humanities and social sciences. This collection also contains titles in ecology, mathematics, and statistics.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 10,000 articles, representing over 143,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences I Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 1 million articles (equaling over 7.4 million pages or 1,800 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences I Breakdown by Discipline





Arts & Sciences II

The Arts & Sciences II Collection adds depth to many disciplines introduced in Arts & Sciences I, such as economics, history, and Asian studies. Arts & Sciences II also offers core journals in several additional disciplines, such as archaeology, classics, and African, Latin American, Middle Eastern, and Slavic studies.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 8,000 articles, representing over 88,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences II Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 750,000 articles (equaling 4.8 million pages or nearly 1,200 linear feet of shelf space savings).


Arts & Sciences III

Arts & Sciences III includes journals in languages and literature, as well as essential titles in the fields of music, film studies, folklore, performing arts, religion, and the history and study of art and architecture.

Additional interdisciplinary titles broaden the scope of coverage to include folklore, feminist & women's studies.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 7,000 articles, representing nearly 71,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences III Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 650,000 articles (equaling more than 4 million pages or 980 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences III Breakdown by Discipline





Arts & Sciences IV

This collection has a strong focus on the professions of business, education, and law, and also includes titles in psychology and public policy and administration. Among the titles are highly influential and diverse publications from leading professional organizations in the fields of business and the social sciences.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 5,700 articles, representing more than 97,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences IV Collection. At present, this collection contains in total over 496,000 articles (equaling 4.6 million pages or 1,100 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences IV Breakdown by Discipline





Arts & Sciences V

This collection builds on previously introduced disciplines, adding important literary reviews and state historical journals. It will also widen the scope of core disciplines in the arts and humanities, such as philosophy, history, classics, religion, art and art history, and language and literature.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 8,000 articles, representing over 72,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences V Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 590,000 articles (equaling 3.6 million pages or 890 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences V Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences VI

The Arts & Sciences VI Collection extends JSTOR's coverage in disciplines across the social sciences, with clusters focused in economics, education, linguistics, political science, and area studies. These often interdisciplinary titles broaden the scope of coverage for the social sciences and expand the range of international scholarship.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 8,600 articles, representing over 94,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences VI Collection. At present, this collection contains in total over 623,000 articles (equaling more than 3.8 million pages or 930 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences VI Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences VII

The Arts & Sciences VII Collection includes more journals in more disciplines than any other JSTOR collection. Its eclectic range of disciplines in the arts, humanities, and social sciences complements research in core disciplines such as history, political science, sociology, art and art history, and language and literature, and the collection represents the largest cluster of health policy titles in JSTOR. Arts & Sciences VII also has the largest collection of international titles with over 15 countries represented.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 10,000 articles, representing over 108,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences VII Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 756,000 articles (equaling almost 5.3 million pages or 1,300 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences VII Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences VIII

The Arts & Sciences VIII Collection broadens JSTOR's coverage of core humanities disciplines including history, language & literature, art & art history, and education. This collection also includes a group of rare 19th and early 20th century American Art periodicals digitized as part of a special project undertaken with the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Frick Collection, and the Brooklyn Museum of Art. This collection also includes journals in philosophy, classical studies, and music.

Through August 2017, we've added more 5,900 than articles, representing over 52,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences VIII Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 518,000 articles (equaling 3.1 million pages or 760 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences VIII Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences IX

The Arts & Sciences IX Collection widens JSTOR's coverage in business and the social sciences. Journals from more than 25 countries provide outstanding international diversity, and rare materials bring unique depth to the collection, with research covering archaeology, anthropology, sociology, business, economics, population studies, and political science.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 5,400 articles, representing over 59,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences IX Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 417,000 articles (equaling more than 3.5 million pages or 870 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences IX Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences X

The Arts & Sciences X Collection covers a broad range of social sciences. Sociology, Education, Public Policy & Administration, and History of Science, Technology & Medicine represent just a few of the disciplines adding new content through this collection, and a selection of titles cross-listed in the Business III Collection contributes scholarship in the fields of Business, Economics, and Finance. The titles included in the Arts & Sciences X Collection will serve researchers, scholars, and professionals in disciplines that rely on science and social science theory, data, and analysis to support their work in the field.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 13,000 articles, representing over 78,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences X Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 444,000 articles (equaling over 3.1 million pages or 780 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences X Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences XI

The Arts & Sciences XI Collection features a diverse group of humanities titles, with scholarship in History, Language & Literature, and Art & Art History. Interdisciplinary titles broaden the scope of the collection to cover area studies such as American Studies, Asian Studies, Latin American Studies, and African American Studies. With content from fifteen countries, Arts & Sciences XI serves scholars, researchers, and students with an interest in region-based humanities.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 10,000 articles, representing over 69,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences XI Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 449,000 articles (equaling over 2.8 million pages or more than 690 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences XI Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences XII

Arts & Sciences XII expands our coverage of the social sciences, and comprises disciplines with high usage and broad appeal. Law, political science, and education content anchors the collection, and other titles in criminology and criminal justice, history, social work, psychology, and sociology complement JSTOR's offerings in the social sciences. Additional titles span African studies, Asian studies, language and literature, and Middle East studies. The collection will feature a minimum of 125 titles at completion, and appeals to both the academic and practitioner audiences.

Through August 2017, we've added over 12,000 articles, representing more than 73,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences XII Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 530,000 articles (equaling more than 2.8 million pages or 700 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences XII Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences XIII

The Arts & Sciences XIII Collection adds an increasingly international set of journals in disciplines including Language & Literature, Art & Art History, Philosophy, and Religion. Represented sub-disciplines include European church history and the literature of the American West. Launched in 2014, the collection will feature a minimum of 125 titles at completion.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 7,400 articles, representing more than 66,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences XIII Collection. At present, this collection contains in total over 394,000 articles (equaling more than 2.6 million pages or 660 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences XIII Breakdown by Discipline




Arts & Sciences XIV

The Arts & Sciences XIV Collection is devoted to the study of culture and communication, from civilization's earliest traces to the growth and governance of peoples. Journals in the collection are drawn from 17 countries, span 23 disciplines, and date back to 1839. Core disciplines in the collection include Archaeology, Language & Literature, Communication Studies, Area Studies and Political Science. Launched in 2015, the collection will feature a minimum of 125 titles at completion.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 6,500 articles, representing more than 52,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences XIV Collection. At present, this collection contains in total over 394,000 articles (equaling more than 2.2 million pages or 550 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Arts & Sciences XV


With Arts & Sciences XV, we aim to encompass the best titles not offered in JSTOR collections before. This collection will have more than 150 titles by 2018. Arts & Sciences XV has extensive coverage in the humanities, social sciences and sciences, including literature, film, art, music, religion, classical studies, history, education, economics, political science, and sociology.

Some titles are drawn from recent discipline-specific collections that were not a part of our earlier Arts & Sciences collections—20 titles newly added to our <u>Mathematics & Statistics collection</u>, and 21 titles from our <u>Jewish Studies collection</u>. As for the rest of the collection, there will be a minimum of 110 brand-new-to-JSTOR titles, selected to round out our core disciplines with particular focus on historically significant journals and those that have become seminal publications for their field.

Through August 2017, we've added 30 new journals and more than 106,000 articles, representing more than 975,000 pages, to the Arts & Sciences XV Collection. At present, this collection contains in total

over 287,000 articles equaling more than 2.3 million pages which represents more than 560 linear feet of shelf space savings.



Life Sciences

At more than 160 journals, the Life Sciences collection is JSTOR's largest, spanning more than 340 years of science history and research in the sciences. The collection features broad coverage of the field sciences as well as health sciences. Disciplines include aquatic science, botany, developmental & cell biology, ecology, paleontology, and zoology.

Through August 2017, we've added nearly 230,000 articles, representing over 463,000 pages, to the Life Sciences Collection. At present, this collection contains in total more than 2.1 million articles (equaling over 9.7 million pages or 2,380 linear feet of shelf space savings).


Sustainability

Launched in March 2017, JSTOR Sustainability is a collection of academic and policy research on environmental stresses and their impact on society. This collection will contain a minimum of 150 journals and 5,000 research reports by its completion in 2018.

The collection was built in collaboration with librarians, scholars and policy researchers, and brings together key journals as well as research reports from leading think tanks worldwide. The collection looks at sustainability and resilience through a broad lens, and spans more than 30 disciplines.

As of August 2017, the collection includes 119 journals and 468,000 journal articles, representing over 2.9 million pages (equaling 712 linear feet of shelf space savings), along with more than 1,900 research reports.

Sustainability Breakdown by Discipline





Business IV

The Business IV Collection builds on the strong economics and business foundation of the Business I, II, and III Collections. Business IV increases JSTOR's coverage in core fields such as economics, management, industrial relations, and finance, with a broad international scope. The collection also contains prominent titles in microeconomics (especially behavioral, labor, health, urban, and development economics) and management (including supply chain management and decision science).

Through August 2017, we've added over 2,300 articles, representing more than 25,000 pages, to the Business IV Collection. To date, this collection contains in total more than 150,000 articles (equaling over 1.2 million pages or 296 linear feet of shelf space savings).

Business IV Breakdown by Discipline





Ecology & Botany II

This collection builds off of the strengths in Ecology & Botany I and broadens JSTOR's scope in the areas of biological and plant sciences. By 2016, the collection will include a minimum of 80 journals. It contains key titles from institutions around the world, including Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew; Naturhistorisches Museum; Società Italiana di Patologia Vegetale, Ecological Society of America, and International Association for Plant Taxonomy.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 7,300 articles, representing more than 73,000 pages, to the Ecology & Botany II Collection. To date, this collection contains in total over 400,000 articles (equaling more than 3 million pages or 750 linear feet of shelf space savings).


JSTOR Essential Collection

The JSTOR Essential Collection features foundational content in the humanities and social sciences. It includes nearly 700 core titles across 45 disciplines, including History, Education, Language & Literature, Business, Political Science, and more.

The journals in the Essential Collection serve both basic and advanced research and teaching needs for two- and four-year institutions. This collection includes the foundational journals in every discipline it covers, including the <u>American Economic Review</u>, the <u>Journal of Consumer Research</u>, <u>Critical Inquiry</u>, the <u>Academy of Management Review</u>, the <u>American Historical Review</u>, the <u>Journal of Marketing</u>, the <u>Harvard Theological Review</u>, the <u>Journal of Political Economy</u>, and more.

Through August 2017, we've added more than 42,000 articles, representing more than 508,000 pages, to the Essential Collection. To date, this collection contains in total over 3.6 million articles (equaling more than 26.1 million pages or 6,415 linear feet of shelf space savings).
